A BILL

To award posthumously thirteen Congressional Gold Medals, in commemoration to the service members who perished in Afghanistan on August 26, 2021, during the evacuation of citizens of the United States and Afghan allies at Hamid Karzai International Airport.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) At 9:44 A.M., on August 26, 2021, the
2	Pentagon confirmed that two explosions occurred at
3	the Hamid Karzai International Airport.
4	(2) The explosions were confirmed to be a sui-
5	cide bombing by ISIS–K terrorist group.
6	(3) At least 103 casualties were reported, in-
7	cluding 13 service members of the United States and
8	several Taliban fighters, as well as hundreds more
9	wounded.
10	(4) The attacks on Thursday, August 26, at the
11	Hamid Karzai International Airport in Kabul, Af-
12	ghanistan, killed 13 United States troops, making it
13	the deadliest single day of the war for the United
14	States in more than a decade.
15	(5) The American service members went above
16	and beyond the call of duty to protect citizens of the
17	United States and our allies to ensure they are
18	brought to safety in an extremely dangerous situa-
19	tion as the Taliban regained control over Afghani-
20	stan.
21	(6) The American service members exemplified
22	extreme bravery and valor against armed enemy
23	combatants.
24	(7) The American service members dedicated
25	their lives and their heroism deserves great honor.

1	(8) Maxton Soviak, Kareem Nikoui, David
2	Espinoza, Rylee McCollum, Jared Schmitz, Hunter
3	Lopez, Taylor Hoover, Daegan William-Tyeler Page,
4	Nicole Gee, Humberto Sanchez, Dylan Merola,
5	Johanny Rosario Pichardo, and Ryan Knauss have
6	been identified as the 13 service members who died
7	from the blast while stationed at Hamid Karzai
8	International Airport.
9	SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDALS.
10	(a) Presentations Authorized.—The Speaker of
11	the House of Representatives and the President pro tem-
12	pore of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements
13	for the posthumous presentation, on behalf of the Con-
14	gress, of thirteen gold medals of appropriate design in
15	commemoration to the service members who perished in
16	Afghanistan, on August 26, 2021.
17	(b) DESIGN AND STRIKING.—For the purposes of the
18	presentations referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
19	of the Treasury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
20	"Secretary") shall strike gold medals with suitable em-
21	blems, devices, and inscriptions, to be determined by the
22	Secretary.
23	(c) Smithsonian Institution.—
24	(1) In general.—Following the award of the
25	gold medals under subsection (a), the gold medal

1	shall be given to the Smithsonian Institution, where
2	it shall be available for display as appropriate and
3	made available for research.
4	(2) Sense of congress.—It is the sense of
5	Congress that the Smithsonian Institution shall
6	make the gold medal received under paragraph (1)
7	available for display elsewhere, particularly at other
8	appropriate locations associated with the thirteen
9	service members perished in Afghanistan, on August
10	26, 2021.
11	SEC. 3. DUPLICATE MEDALS.
12	The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
13	bronze of the gold medals struck pursuant to section 2
14	under such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, at
15	a price sufficient to cover the cost thereof, including labor,
16	materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.
17	SEC. 4. STATUS OF MEDALS.
18	(a) National Medals.—The medals struck pursu-
19	ant to this Act are national medals for purposes of chapter
20	51 of title 31, United States Code.
21	(b) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section
22	5134 of title 31, United States Code, all medals struck
23	under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.
